I refer to your email dated 15 May 2025.

I note that you have requested a copy of the "amended letter" referred to in the letters to each of you dated 25 March 2025. Please note that the reference to an "amended letter" was a typographical error.

The reference should have been to the corrections of the two inadvertent errors that were identified for each of following letters: (1) the letter to Ms Odtojan dated 8 July 2024; and (2) the letter to Mr Bryl dated 17 July 2024; and which were explained to you in the letters to you dated 25 March 2025. Specifically, that the references to "prior conduct" and "prior misconduct" in those earlier letters to each of you, should have read "alleged prior conduct" and "alleged prior misconduct" as shown in the extracts from the relevant paragraphs, marked up (in red underline text) below:

Letter to Ms Odtojan dated 8 July 2024 (on page 8 under the heading "Next Steps"):

"Next steps

Council will need to consider whether your <u>alleged</u> prior conduct as detailed above, is incompatible with the holding of a practising certificate. Council will, however, need to consider whether since that time you have taken steps to address the <u>alleged</u> prior misconduct such that you may now be considered to be fit and proper to hold a practising certificate."

Letter to Mr Bryl dated 17 July 2024 (on page 6 under the heading "Next Steps"):

"Next steps

Council will need to consider whether your <u>alleged</u> prior conduct as detailed above, is incompatible with the holding of a practising certificate. Council will, however, need to consider whether since that time you have taken steps to address the <u>alleged</u> prior misconduct such that you may now be considered to be fit and proper to hold a practising certificate." As previously stated, the Law Society of NSW will revert to you in due course regarding the outcome of your applications for renewal of your 2024/25 practising certificate.
